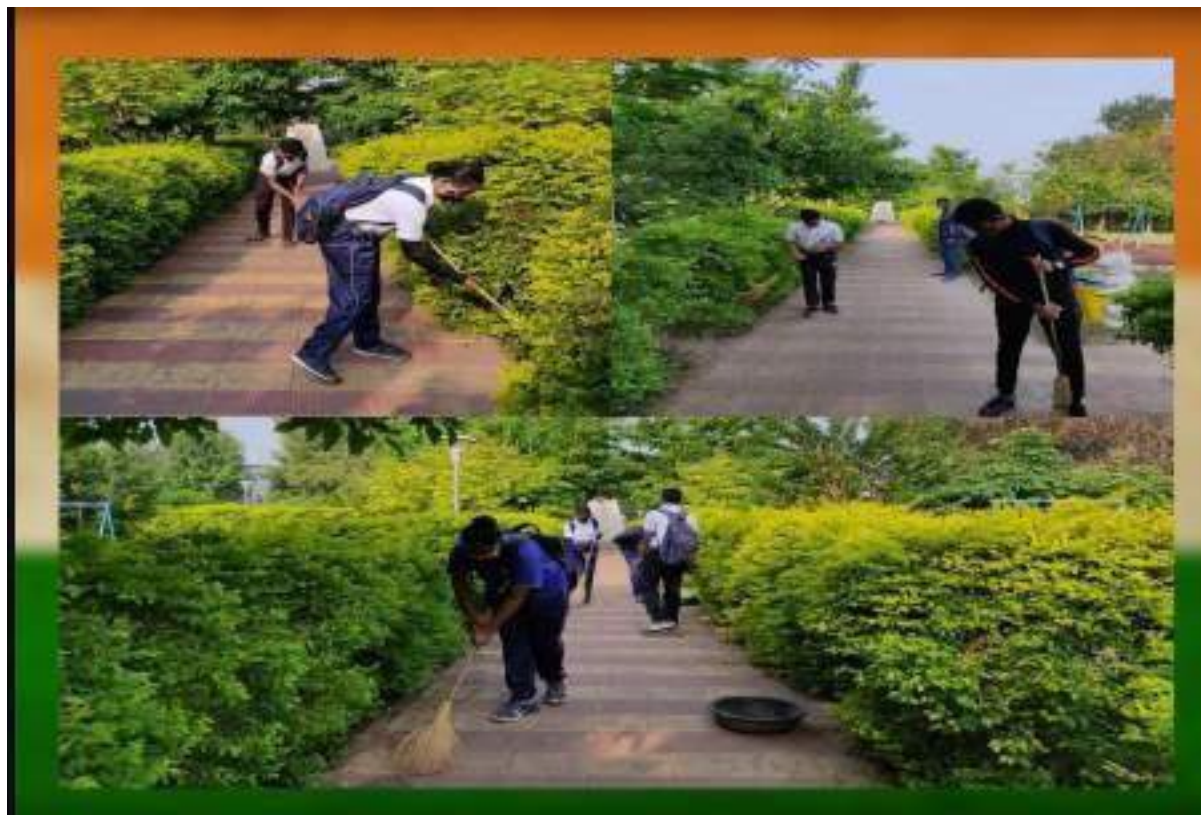

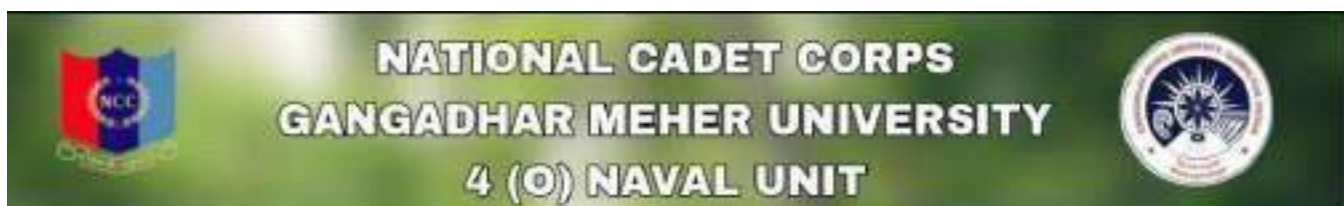

WORLD TOBACCO DAY

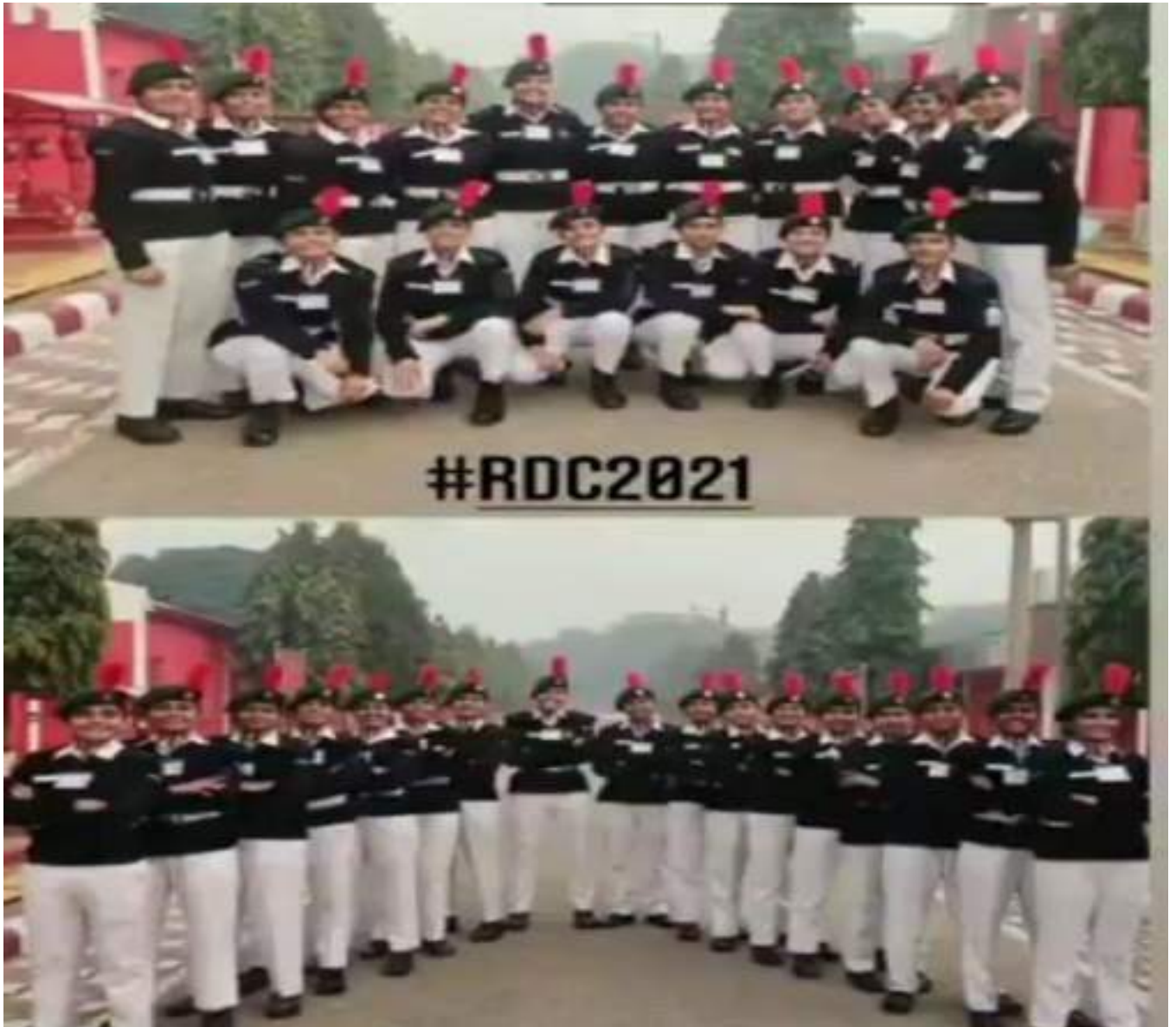
Date: - 31 May 2021

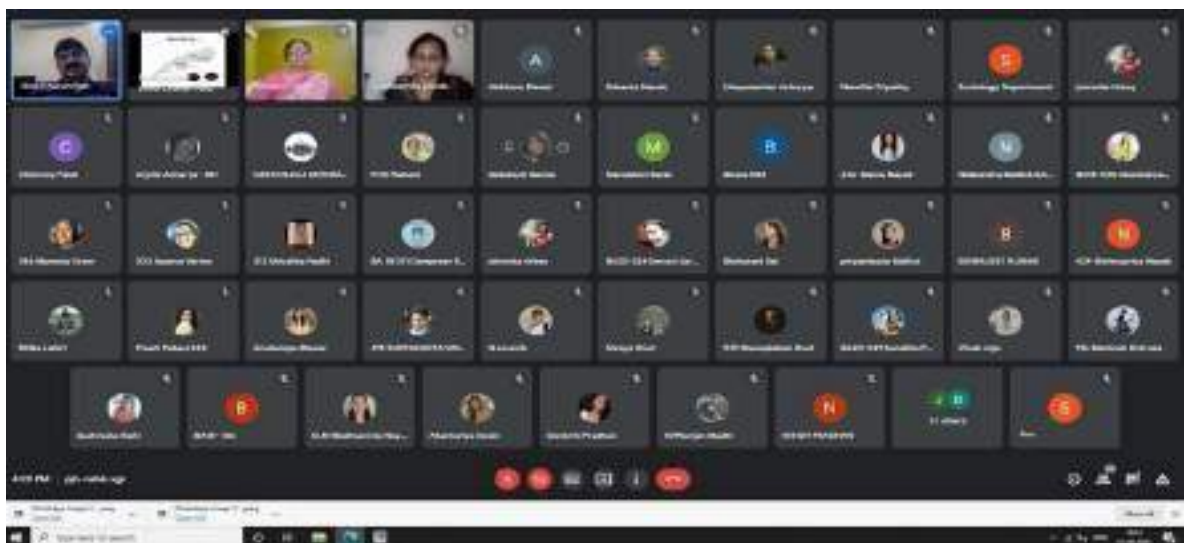
- International Day Against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking 2021

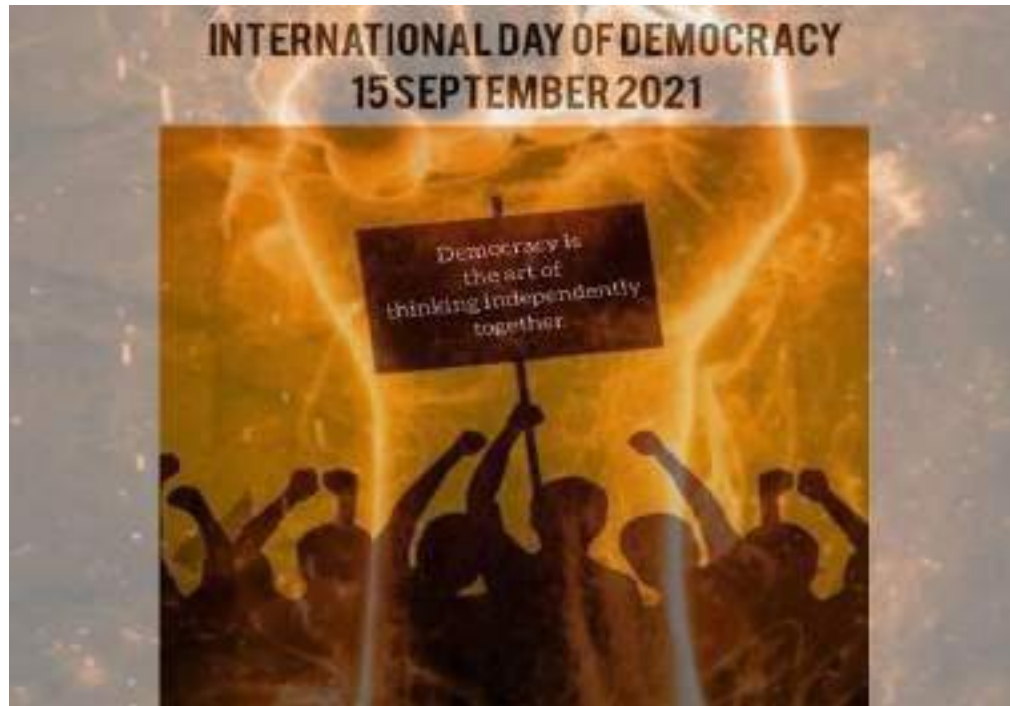
- **Fit India Freedom Run 2.0**

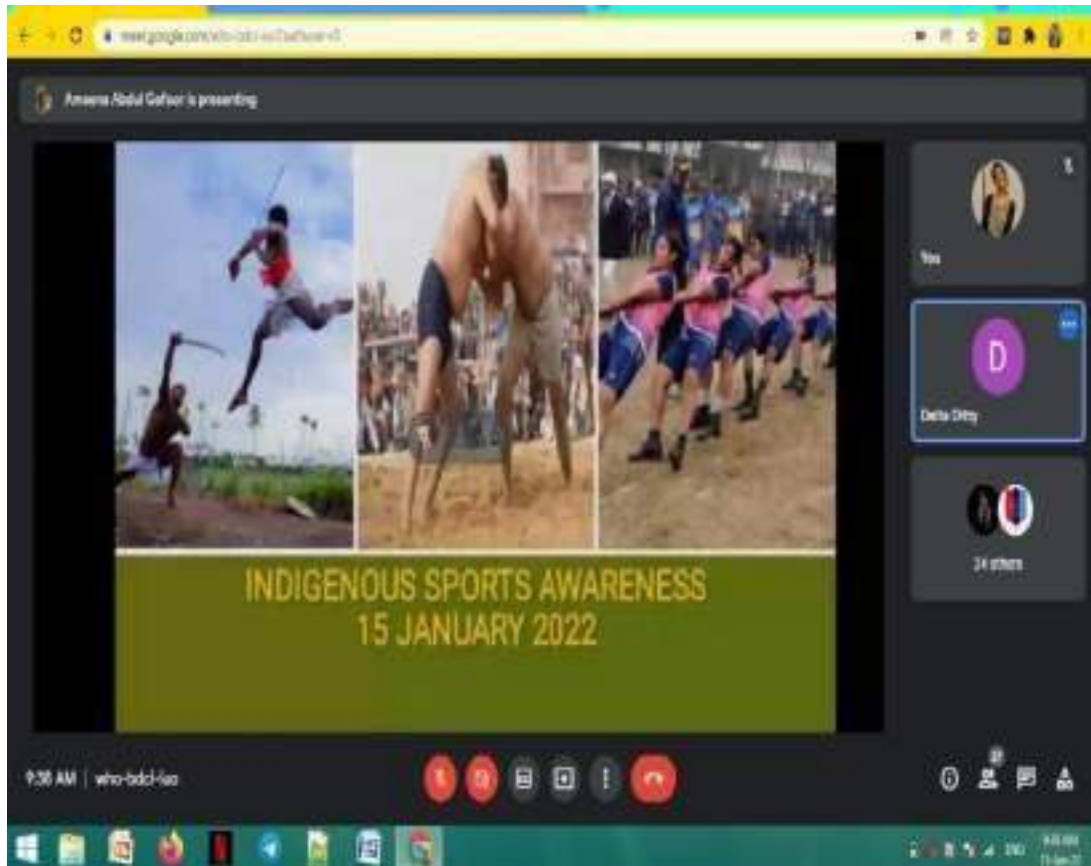

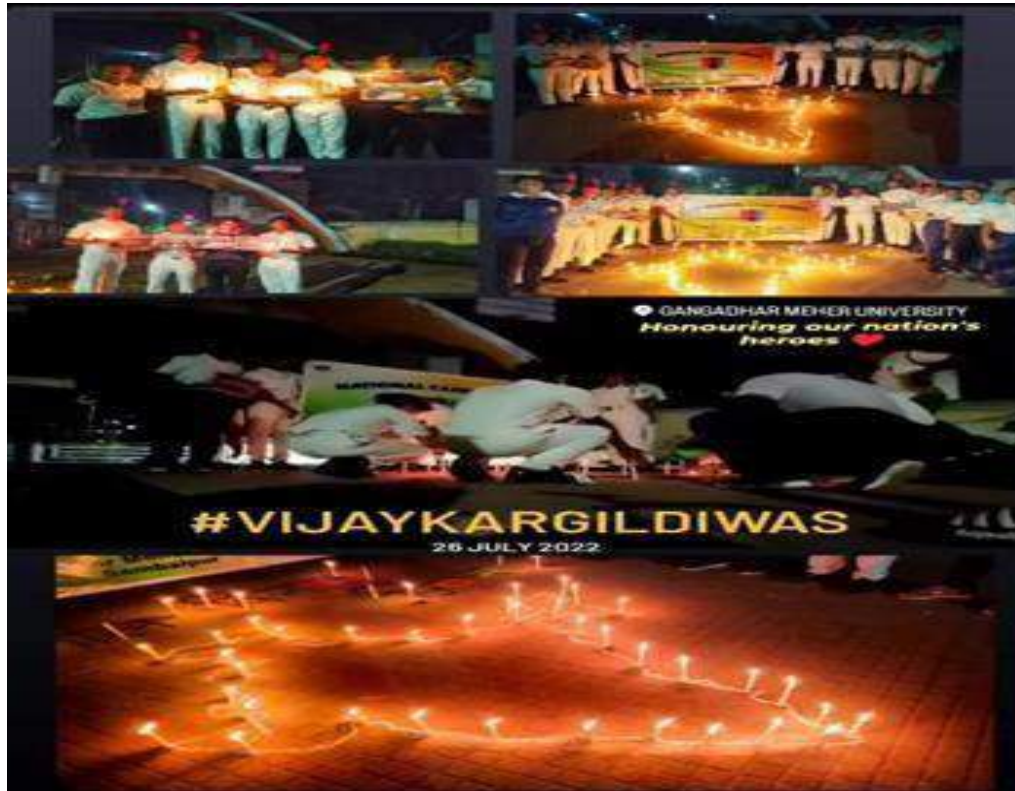
